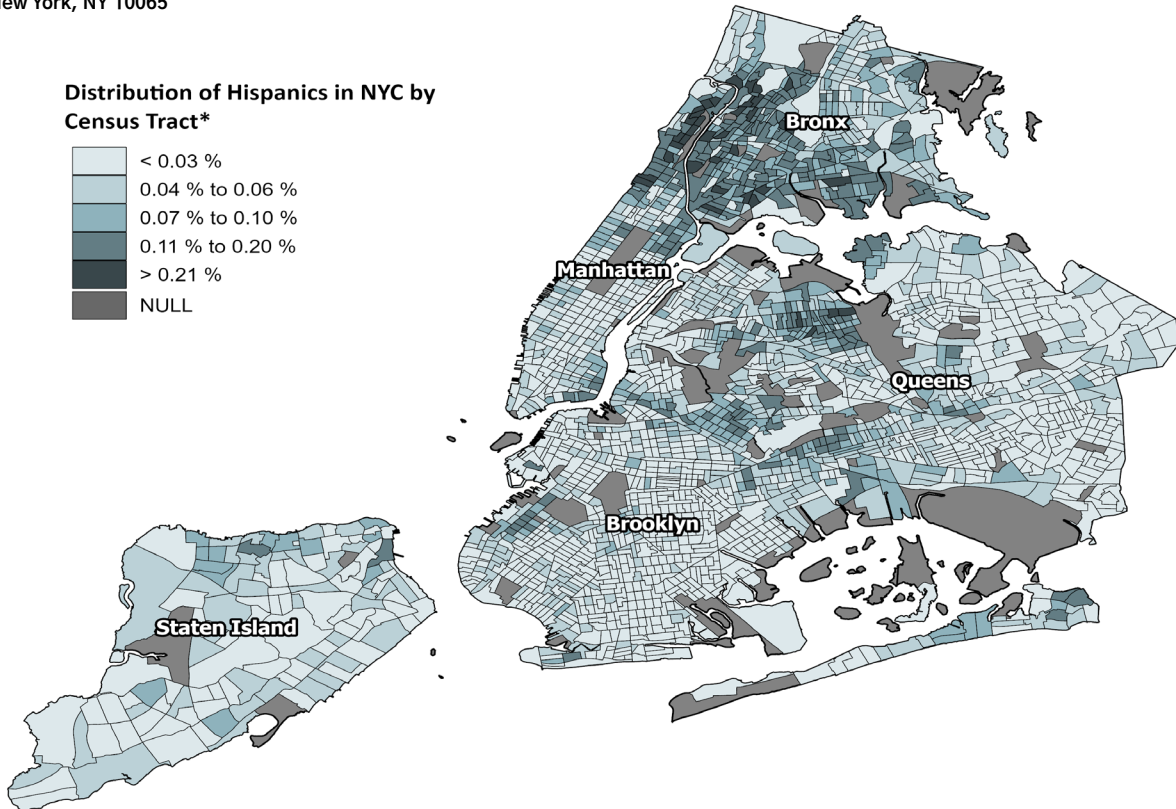
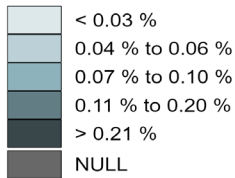


Distribution of Hispanics in NYC by Census Tract*
