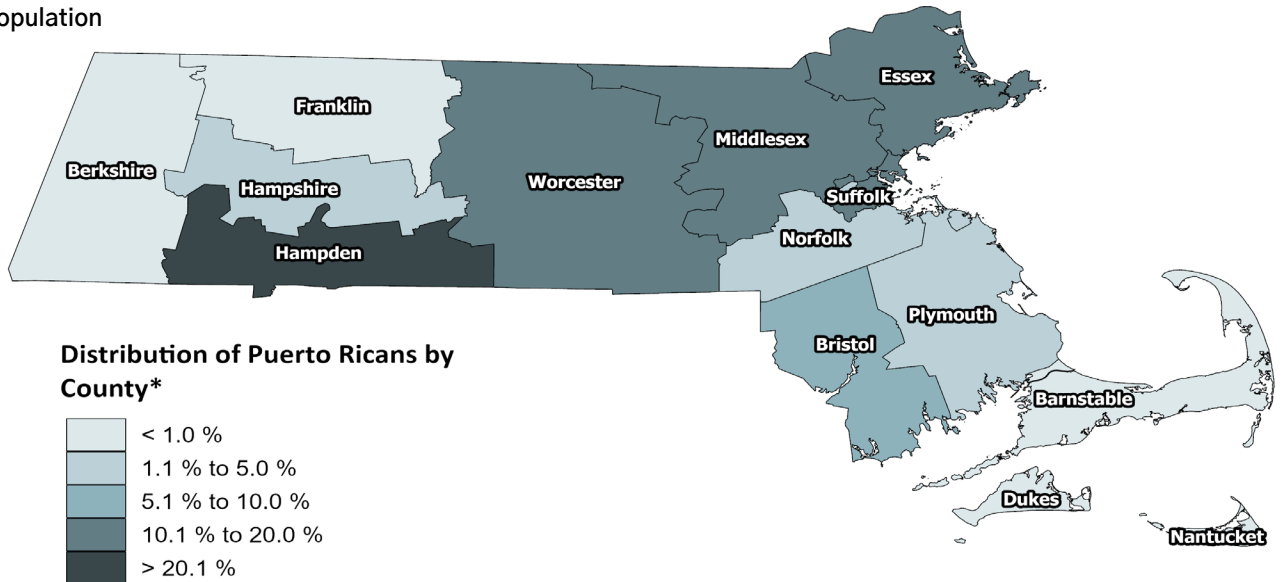


Massachusetts is ranked
