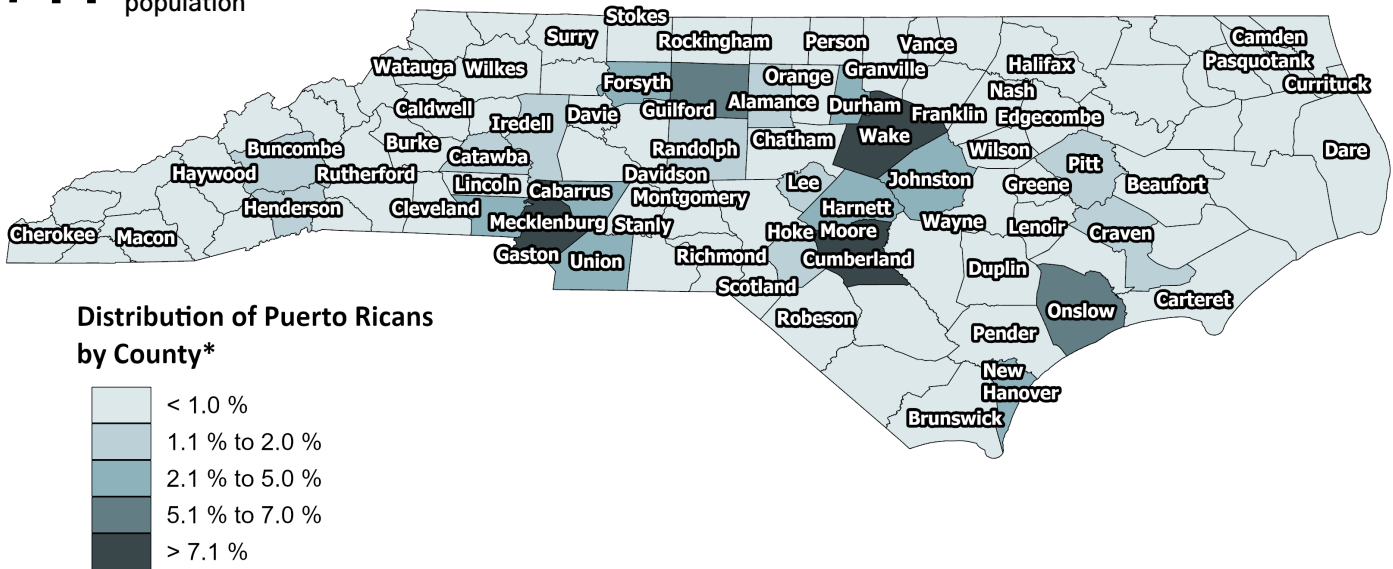


## North Carolina is ranked
